We have spent a lot of time praying and thinking about another adoption and it feels right for our family.

We are a couple with great faith in God. We both grew up in homes where faith was important, and our parents modeled unconditional love and moral integrity. Kate does not work in the ministry, but personal faith plays an important role in her job as a social worker at a local hospital working primarily with adults with life limiting illnesses.




Love, James and Kate Barnes's first international trip to Vancouver when he was 10 months old.






### By James



# About Our Community





Arriving at the hospital the night that Barnes was born both exciting and nerve-racking. We were so excited to become parents and so thankful that Barnes's birthmother chose us to parent her son. Our hope for Barnes and any other children we parent is that they grow up happy healthy, and whole. We want to foster an environment where Barnes feels comfortable to be the person he is and know that we love him unconditionally. For our children, we want them to have access to good education and take school seriously, but it is not required that they make all A's. We hope for them to find their way in the world standing on their own two feet one day, knowing that we are always there to support them in any way practical.

In all honesty, thinking about how to integrate birthparents into the lives of our adopted children was difficult to visualize prior to adoption. The reality of parenting an adopted child has helped us to see that maintaining communication with birth families is important to a child. There is a role and relationship distinct from ours as adoptive parents that our children may need with their birth families. We want to support and foster that relationship in ways that contribute to the healthy development of a sense of identity for our children.




