





We have a passion for cooking at home and trying new things in the kitchen. Our extended family lives nearby, and we enjoy every moment we get to spend together. Most of all, we enjoy being at home with our 2 dachshunds as our own 'little' family. Our devotion to Christianity is important to us, and despite having different backgrounds in our faith Robert having been raised Catholic and Amy being raised Methodist. We see value in both of our faiths and attend services at St. Louis Catholic Church, where Robert was baptized, and First Methodist Waco, where we were married and where Amy's parents also attend service. We are also active members of The Blend Sunday school class at First Methodist Waco, where we are building lasting friendships centered around our Christian faith.
- HOME: Our home is centered in a 1950s era neighborhood that includes a lot of young couples and families with young children. Our neighborhood is just a few miles from numerous public and private schools, parks, retail shopping, and downtown, where Amy's office is located. Amy takes enjoyment from doing home improvement projects and always finding ways to add our own touch to our home.
- PETS: We have two miniature dachshunds. Miss Marty (5 years old), a long-haired chocolate and tan dachshund, and Mr. Domino (4 years old), a short-haired black, white, and tan dapple dachshund. - WHY ARE YOU INTERESTED IN BUILDING YOUR FAMILY THROUGH ADOPTION? We had hoped to start our family at the onset of our marriage but ran into challenges not only due to our age but also due to preexisting medical conditions. After 4 years of fertility treatments, that proved unsuccessful, and Amy's diagnosis of endometriosis, we decided to investigate other ways to start our family. We decided that Domestic Infant Adoption was the best way to grow our family as we believe that children are a gift from God. "Before I formed you in the womb, I knew you" (Jeremiah 1:5).
- OPENNESS TO BIRTHPARENT(S): We know this will be the most difficult decision our birth mother will ever make, and we want them to voice their expectations of how much contact they would like, but also realize this could change over time. Our hope is for our child to have the opportunity to spend time with their birth mother annually, and depending on location, have the opportunity for additional visits as schedules allow. If our child's mother is located outside the state, we hope to find ways to meet at convenient locations for both family and birth mother to continue fostering the open relationship. We also intend to maintain regular calls/texts, letters/emails, and photos, and are open to determining that frequency together with the birth mother.
- CHILDCARE PLANS: We both intend to continue to work after placement. Robert works remotely full-time, and Amy's work is full-time at her office, but has the flexibility for remote work as needed. For the first 6 months we will rely on inhome family childcare until our child is old enough to attend daycare. We plan to enroll our child in Piper Center for Family Studies and Child Development at Baylor University, where we are currently on the waitlist. Once our child is 3 years old, we plan to enroll our child in Bishop Louis Reicher Catholic School, a private Catholic school in our church parish.

IF CHOSEN BY YOU, OUR HOPE IS FOR OUR CHILD TO HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO SPEND TIME IN-PERSON WITH YOU annually, and depending on your location, we are open to additional visits as schedules allow.
