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



Home

The back of the house features a large, screened porch that faces a fenced-in, grassy yard and woods. The house is located on 1.5 acres of woods off a cul-de-sac in a neighborhood atop a ridge. Behind our land is another 500 acres of woodland, full of life. We are right along a birding trail and can watch herds of deer from our bedroom windows. Our ridge is just up the hill from a quaint, walkable small town and 15 minutes from the capitol city. The little town is set along a beautiful river and boasts a long riverwalk with a playground, library, sports complex, shops, and restaurants. The town also hosts festivals throughout the year trick-or-treating and pumpkin patches in the fall, the Charles Dickens Celebration and Christmas tree farms in the winter, weekly art and farmers markets in the spring, and the Jazz and Blues festival in the summer.



Tucked away in a fire-resistant safe of our most precious documents is a video we took while camping on a coffee plantation in Colombia when we were newly married. After we married, we got licensed to be foster parents. fostered two toddlers for a year before custody was transferred to one of their relatives. After having our biological daughter, Blaise, we knew that we wanted another child. We tried to have another biological child but had difficulty getting pregnant. Wanting to be of help while we waited, we fostered another baby whom we loved, but she also went to live with a relative. After learning that Laurel had some hormone deficiencies that may make getting pregnant especially difficult, we felt like we should go ahead and start the process of adopting.

Openness to birthparent(s): Through serving as foster parents, we have learned that a child's relationship with their birth family is important, and we want to ensure that any child in our home has as many pieces of their own story and identity as we can give them. When we consider what contact with the child's family may be like, we imagine regular updates with pictures and videos when the child is young (we have learned that babies and toddlers are not especially good at FaceTime), and then calls, FaceTime, and visits (if feasible) as the child gets older. We understand that the needs of all parties may change over time, but we hope that the commitment to doing the best we can for the child stays consistent. In the past, we have made sure that our foster children got to see and communicate with their parents and/or siblings regularly in a safe, relaxed environment. We hope to build a relationship of trust with our child's birth parents and imagine them serving a role like that of an aunt and uncle. We realize that this may look differently depending on where the parents are located, but we believe that current technology can help us bridge some of the gaps in distance.

Childcare plans: Seth has 6 weeks of paid parental leave and works from home 100% of the time, so he will be available to care for the child for 6 weeks and will still be home after his parental leave ends. Laurel will be eligible for unpaid parental leave, which she plans to take. She also works a hybrid work schedule, so she will be home a few days a week after the end of parental leave. Seth's mother, Renee, is retired and lives in our basement apartment, so she will be available to care for the child after Seth and Laurel's parental leave ends (though they will still be working from home with the child).

First 6 weeks: Seth & Laurel care for the child 24/7.

After 6 weeks: Renee will care for the child in the Davis home with Seth (full-time) & Laurel (part -time) there.
